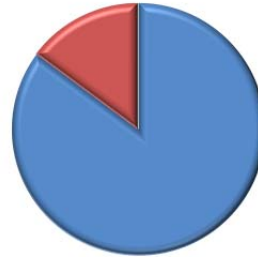


## How are the following SETROPTS JES options set on the majority of your Production z/OS systems?

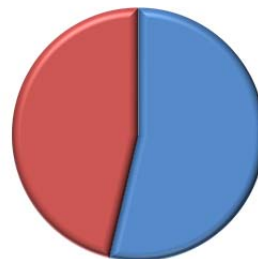

This option only applies to JES2. The use of Execution Batch Monitors (XBMs) is extremely rare.

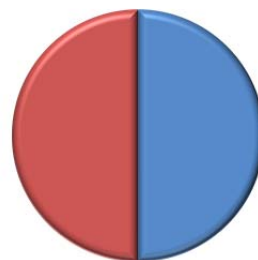

This option activated password authentication for batch IDs immediately upon submission in releases of JES prior to 3.1.3. This functionality was added to JES 3.1.3, which was released in 1990. This option is now meaningless.
